<b>INTRODUCTORY COURSES</b>	<p>One course each in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•<u>Ethics</u>: PHIL 175 or DS</li> <li>•<u>Political Science</u>: Intro to: Int'l Relations (PLSC 111), Comparative Politics (PLSC 116) or American Politics (PLSC 113)</li> <li>•<u>Political Philosophy</u>: PHIL 178, PLSC 108, PLSC 114, PLSC 118, PLSC 119 or DS</li> <li>•<u>Other Perspectives</u>: e.g. history, sociology, anthropology, ER&amp;M, WGSS (decided in consultation with the EPE DUS), or DS</li> <li>•<u>Intro Microeconomics</u>: ECON 108, 110 or ECON 115</li> <li>•<u>Intro Macroeconomics</u>: ECON 111 or ECON 116</li> <li>•<u>Econometrics</u>: ECON 117, ECON 123, ECON 135, GLBL 121, S&amp;DS 230 OR S&amp;DS 238</li> <li>•<u>Game Theory</u>: EPE 220, EPE 231, EPE 295, EPE 297 or ECON 159</li> </ul>
<b>NUMBER OF COURSES</b>	Fifteen, <b>including</b> senior essay requirement.

<b>DISTRIBUTION OF COURSES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•<u>Core courses</u>: Classics of EPE and 2 more core courses in two out of three core areas, one must be an advanced seminar (a list of eligible courses is provided each semester by EP&amp;E)</li> <li>•<u>Area of concentration</u>: 3 courses (includes senior essay requirement)</li> </ul>
<b>SENIOR REQUIREMENT</b>	Senior essay in area of concentration (in a seminar or in EP&E 491, or EP&E 492 and 493)
