<b>DISTRIBUTION OF COURSES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Core courses</u>: Classics of EPE and 2 more core courses in two out of three core areas, one must be an advanced seminar (a list of eligible courses is provided each semester by EP&amp;E)</li> <li>• <u>Area of concentration</u>: 3 courses (includes senior essay requirement)</li> </ul>
<b>SENIOR REQUIREMENT</b>	Senior essay in area of concentration (in a seminar or in EP&E 4491, or EP&E 4492 and 4493)
